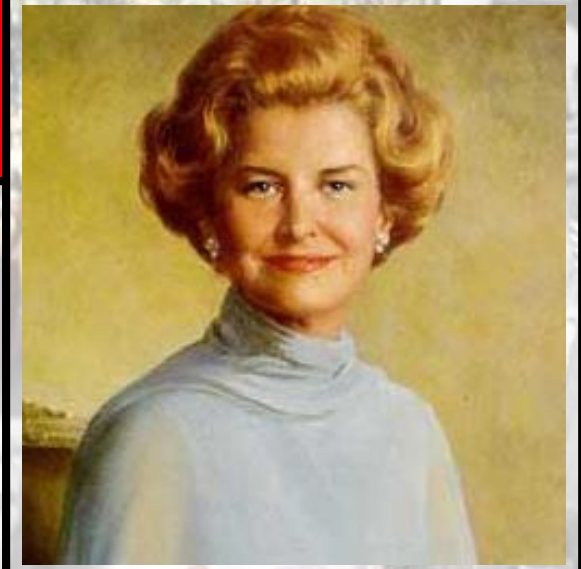

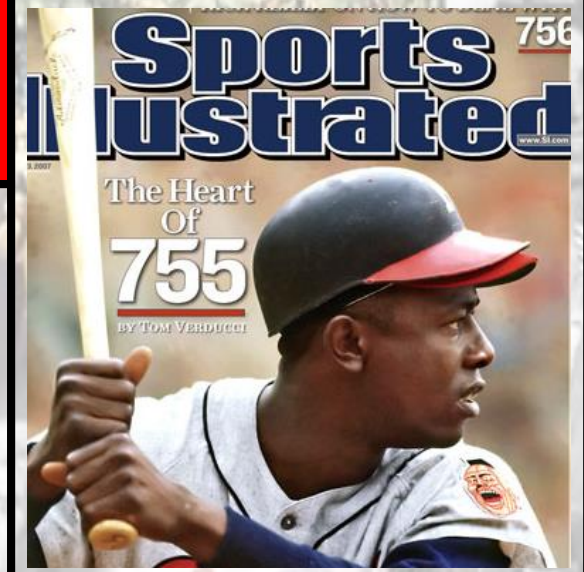


1974
