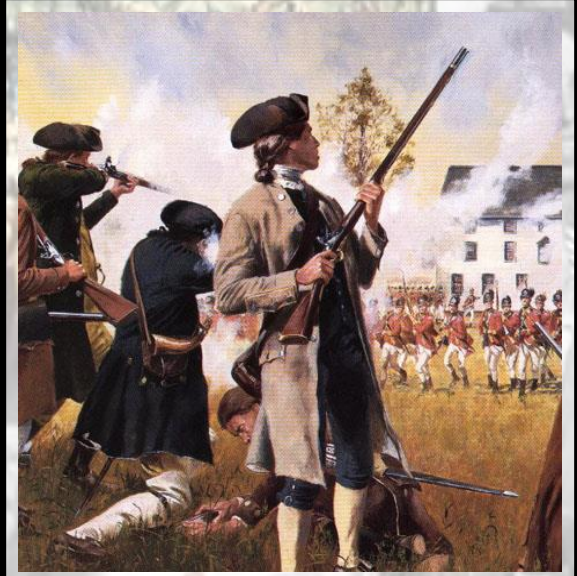


1775

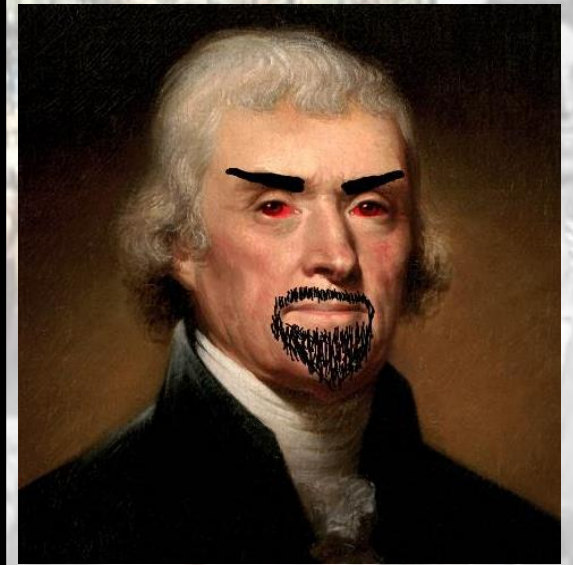

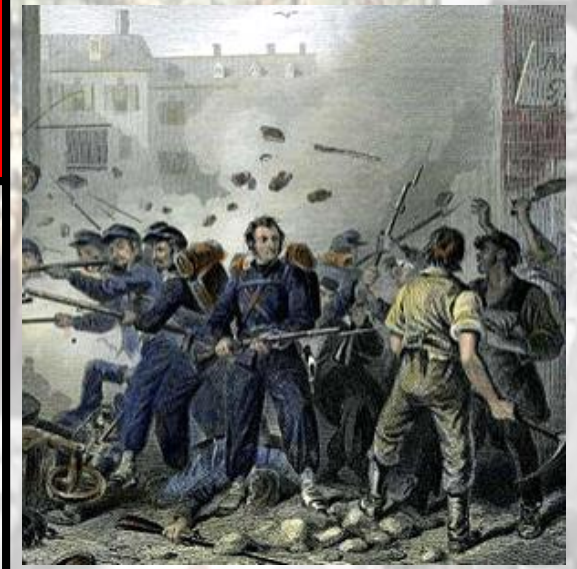


1861



The first “legit” bloodshed of the Civil War occurs in Baltimore, MD when a secessionist mob attacks troops from MA. Four soldiers and 12 rioters are killed.

1897



The 1st marathon in the U.S. is run in Boston. John J. McDermott of NY wins the first race with a time of 2:55:10. *(No girls allowed until 1972.)*

1943



In Poland, Jews rise up against the Nazis. By May 16th, the uprising is subdued with 300 Nazis killed. The city's Jews are sent to concentration camps.
