


## What is Black History Month?

In February 1926, black historian Dr. Carter G. Woodson organized the celebration of "Negro History Week" during the second week of February in honor of the birthdays of Frederick Douglass and Abraham Lincoln. The week-long celebration grew in popularity, and by the early 1970s, it expanded to include the entire month.

Native Americans seize Wounded Knee in South Dakota, demanding an investigation of their problems. Officers kill 2.
