What is Hispanic Heritage Month?

Unlike Black History Month and Women's History Month that cover entire months, Hispanic Heritage Month begins and ends in two different months, running from **September 15th – October 15th**. It started as a week long celebration in Los Angeles in **1968** and expanded in **1988**. (**Sept. 15th** commemorated the **1821** independence of 5 Lat. Amer. countries.)








1927




1957


